I received approval from our administrators to test your Bayou Backer product at Marsh Island Refuge. We can commit to providing logistical assistance (i.e., hauling equipment, people, etc.) for setting up the test plots. Also, we can assist with some very basic monitoring after the project is implemented. However, we cannot commit to providing labor to install your product. We do not have sufficient personnel to install the synthetic grass without additional assistance. Thus, we need to work on coordinating volunteers, parish trustees, or hired help to assist. I spoke with Charles Stemmans and Wayne Mouton (a local FFA teacher) today about coordinating student volunteers to assist. Mr. Mouton said for me to give him some potential dates and he would let us know if he could assist. Also, we may be able to discuss with Charles the possibility of coordinating trustee assistance. ## To Whom it may concern:



I first met Mr. Lazaro in 2008 when he visited from Arizona to introduce the CWPPRA program to Bayou Backer. I was impressed then, and remain so today with the idea of Bayou Backer and with the perseverance of Mr. Lazaro. This letter is to provide my professional opinion of Bayou Backer, an erosion control product developed by Mr. Joseph Lazaro. I have over twenty years of professional experience in coastal zone planning and management and have worked on numerous coastal planning initiatives for local, state and federal agencies, non-profit organizations and private sector businesses. I was introduced to Bayou Backer through a presentation to the Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act (CWPPRA) Regional Planning Team given by Mr. Lazaro at a public meeting in 2008. I was intrigued by the simplicity of the product and impressed with Mr. Lazaro's commitment to finding an affordable solution to slow land loss due to erosion.

Based on my review of the results of wave tank experiments with Bayou Backer conducted by the Louisiana State University Coastal Studies Institute and photo documentation from actual test sections implemented in Louisiana over the past eight years, I am convinced that Bayou Backer has great wave attenuation potential for inland shorelines. The installation technique development by Mr. Lazaro allows for installation without the need to dredge an access channel, making Bayou Backer particularly useful in shallow bays and lakes.

To whom it may concern;

I am William P. Edwards III and I hold a BA degree in Biology from Centenary College of Louisiana.

I began working for Vermilion Corporation in 1980, first as assistant manager, then general manager, vice president, ultimately serving as president and general manager some 20 years later and retiring in 2013.

Vermilion Corporation manages 125,000 acres of fresh ,intermediate ,brackish and saline marshes in Vermilion parish for all of the traditional uses of the property ;hunting ,fishing ,shrimping ,crabbing ,alligators ,cattle grazing ,and some rice farming .It was therefore vital for us to maintain a healthy marsh .As a result I was very observant of even the slightest detail of the system .One observation ,that ultimately brought Mr. Lazaro to Louisiana is the fact that when a portion of a water body contains submerged aquatic vegetation (savs) the wave action in that area of the water body is greatly diminished . Any observant duck hunter should be able to verify this for you.

Mr. Lazaro's invention, Bayou Backer does just that ,and he literally sold the farm and moved to Louisiana a to prove it .Louisiana needs another tool in it's tool box to combat shoreline erosion .Rock is too expensive and has fallen out of favor as public agencies and others begin to realize the potential liability. I would strongly urge you to support Mr. Lazaro's proposal so that he might get the opportunity to prove his concept ,which mother nature demonstrates each year outside of the winter months .
